For the past four years, MS. AMBRIA MADDOX 's community service engagement has been focused on helping military families. In 2013, prior to MS. AMBRIA MADDOX going into 6th grade, her brother Anthony lost his life while serving in the Army in Afghanistan.

Through her personal life experience, and grief journey, MS. AMBRIA MADDOX has demonstrated empathy and has seen the value in engaging with military, Gold Star families and local community to promote inclusion, while honoring our military fallen. She has used her time, and talent to assist the Americas Gold Star Families (AGSF) 501C3 organization with their Fallen Hero Tree of Honor project. She has created very unique and personalized ornaments of fallen heroes which are placed on Christmas trees at various locations in the community during the holiday season. Creating the ornaments is her way to honor her brother and other fallen soldiers. She also participates in the setup of the trees, decorating, and disassembling them on an annual basis. Her engagement with this project has brought the community together to bring hope, healing, increased community awareness and advocacy for honoring and remembering the sacrifice of our fallen military and their families.

This has been a humbling & healing experience for MS. AMBRIA MADDOX , and a true-life lesson. Until you experience and

understand each other's perspective, you will not understand or relate to different experiences. Being inclusive, communicating, and connecting brings change, and healing. Even though she hopes that others will not have to endure military loss, she understands the importance of accepting others, their differences, and the value of serving others.

She is now looking to be a member of the Best Buddies program at her school, which allows her to partner with a disabled student, to help them at school, and through their journey. We all have a story to tell, yet we must listen, and seek to understand. She has been a good role model, and a good citizen. She understands we cannot do this life alone. It requires positive support, and relationship building with all individuals, regardless of our differences or similarities. This will advance harmony between all mankind.
